- Founded in 1869, Shadyside Campus on Woodland Road is the historic home of Chatham University. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Undergraduate Students

- Completed online application for admission at apply.chatham.edu/ undergraduate (free of charge) or submit the Common Application.
- · Admissions essay.
- All official secondary and postsecondary transcripts, mark sheets or records, officially translated into English if not in English. Credential evaluation is not required for non-U.S. postsecondary academic records, but may be requested.
- Official test scores TOEFL, IELTS, STEP, SAT or ACT (Chatham code: 2081)
 - Non-native English speakers must submit a TOEFL (Test of English as a
 Foreign Language) score of 525 and above on the paper-based TOEFL
 (PBT) or 79 and above on the internet based test (iBT), an IELTS score of 6.5
 or above, pre-Grade 1 on the STEP-EIKEN. Students who score less than this
 may be admitted in to the English Language Program or Pittsburgh
 Pathways through conditional admission.
 - TOEFL can be waived for students who want to start in the English Language Program full time.
 - Native English speakers must submit SAT I or ACT scores.
- · One letter of recommendation.
- Copy of passport photo page (with identification information).
- Copy of immigration documents (if currently living in the United States).
- Proof of financial support (official bank statement, signed bank letter, or financial guarantee indicating enough funds to cover the first year of education at Chatham).

- All official postsecondary academic records officially translated into English if not in English. Credential evaluation is not required for non-U.S. academic records, but may be requested.
- Copy of passport photo page (with identification information).
- Copy of immigration documents if living in the U.S.
- Official test scores: TOEFL, IELTS, iTEP, or PTE (Chatham code: 2081)
 (See English Language Requirements).
- Supporting applicant supplied documents, such as
 - Essay/personal statement
- Résumé/CV
- Recommendations
- Portfolio
- Official bank statement, signed bank letter or financial guarantee verifying sufficient funds to cover the full cost of the first year of education at Chatham University. See cost of attendance details at www.chatham.edu/admission/tuition.

English Language Requirements

Any applicant who is a non-native English speaker must provide proof of English language proficiency:

- If you have graduated from a baccalaureate or master's program in the United States, United Kingdom, Canada (not including Quebec), Ireland, New Zealand, Australia or an English-speaking Caribbean island country, a test score is not required.
- 2. Submit official TOEFL, IELTS, PTE or iTEP results, directly from the testing agency.

Applicants with test results in the following ranges will be required to take the English language placement exam once arriving on campus and may be required to take subsequent language coursework concurrent with their program coursework:

- IELTS: 6.5
- iTEP: 3.8

Students who do not meet minimum English language proficiency requirements may apply to the English Language Program (www. chatham.edu/elp) or apply for conditional admission.
